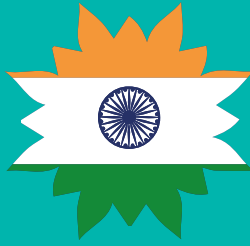

# TELLING A STORY

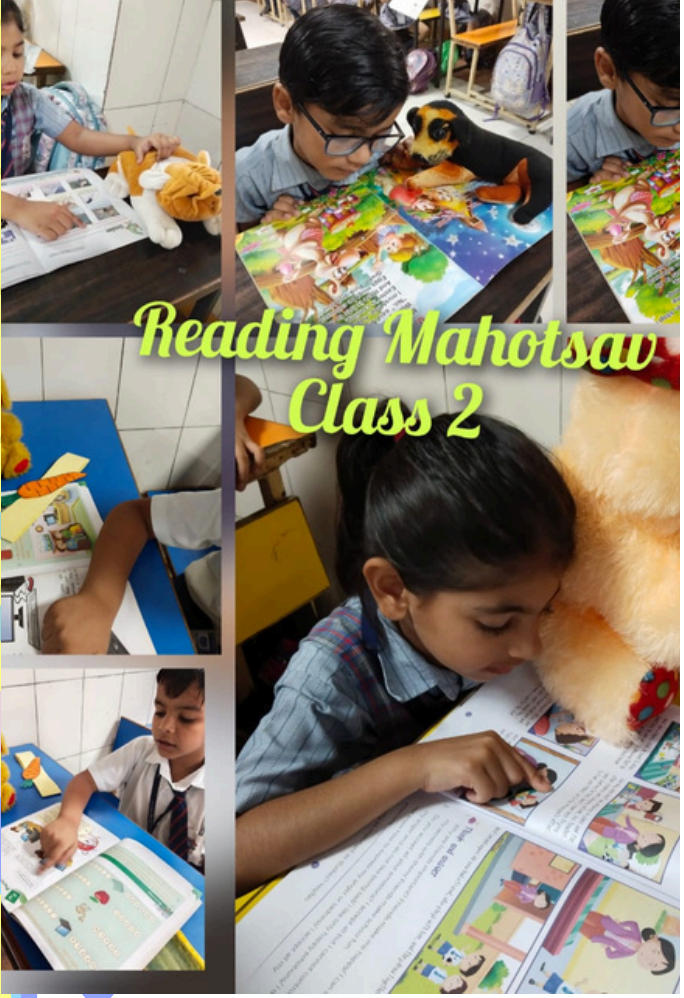
Day 1

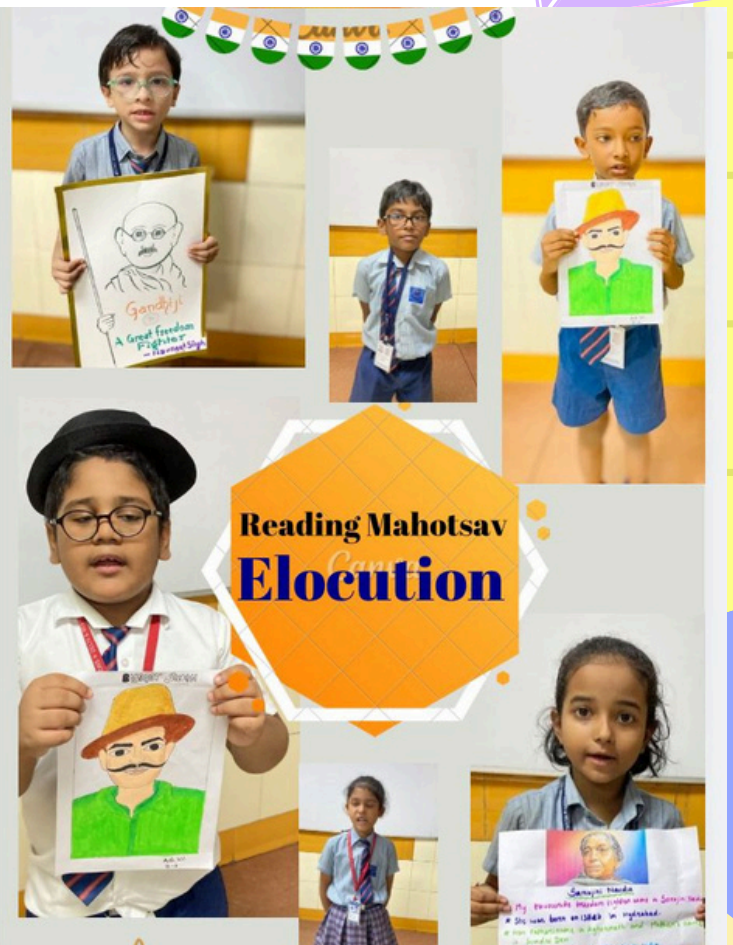


# ELOCUTION

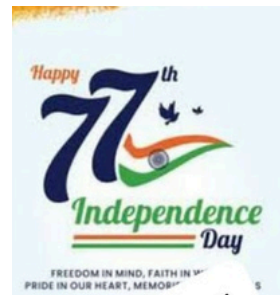

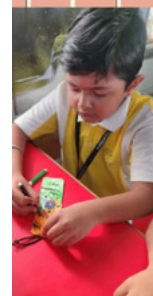

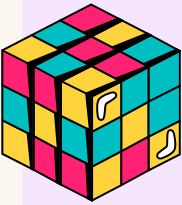
# LIFE SKILLS

## My Hygiene Kit

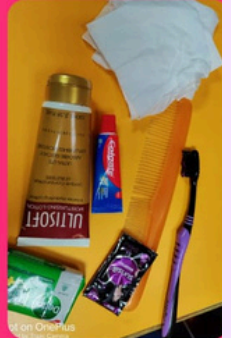
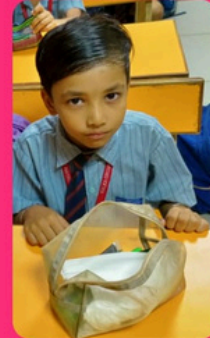

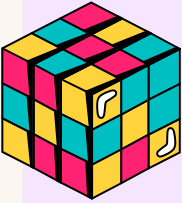




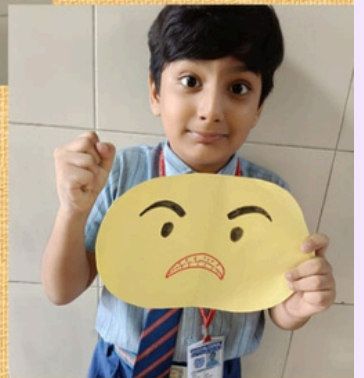
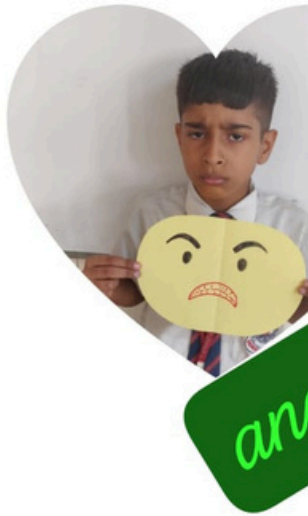
# LIFE SKILLS

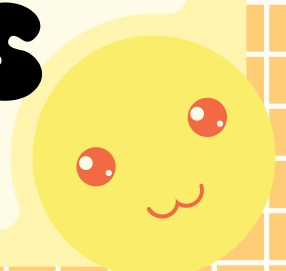

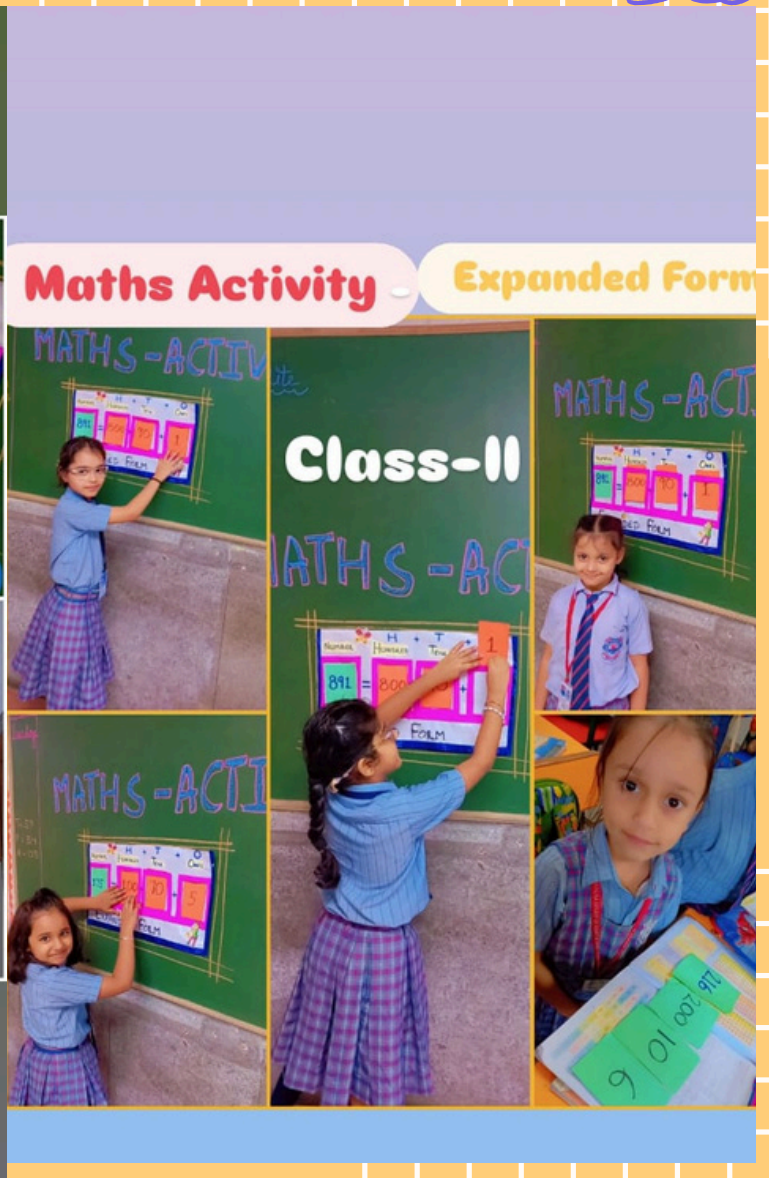




# MATHS

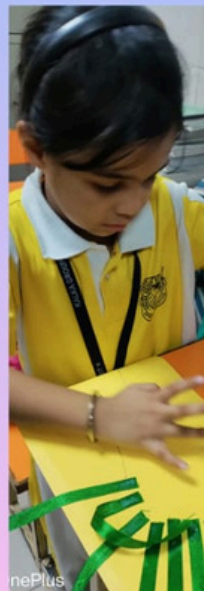
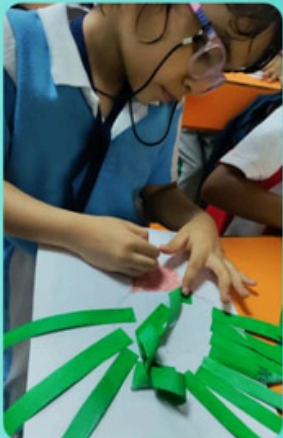


# HARIYALI TEEJ
